Out of District Services:

1. We currently have a balance of \$64,609.31 the outstanding services that have been provided outside of the district boundaries since 2012. Of the out of district services provided, nine incidents, with a total of \$ 29,210.37 are in collections. Total unpaid balance that is not in collections is \$ 35,398.94

Maintenance:

- 1. Engine 302 pump is leaking. Pump was inspected by WW Williams and the quote provided is \$4,152.73. We are seeking a second opinion and quote.
- 2. Tender 303 is having a battery/charging issue. Batteries will need to be replaced soon.
- 3. Medic 301 had rear step damage. Step replaced and installed.
- 4. NET 30 will be going to Tucson for wheelchair lift repairs soon and have new tires installed.
- 5. Our gurneys had annual maintenance completed on February 27, 2020.
- 6. Our annual pump, ladder, and SCBA cascade maintenance and inspection is scheduled for Thursday.

Communication:

- 1. On site fuel tanks: We have received the information needed through SOCO. We are now looking for a less expensive base options for the tanks. The electrical quote is \$720. I have completed the drawing and will send it to the State Fire Marshalls office for approval once the fuel tank company provides the correct UL listing number.
- 2. The fire hydrant committee: Nothing new to report.
- 3. Cochise County Health Department: Follow up Hepatitis A shots are being conducted at the Cochise County Health Department. If we see a need from our community, we can schedule a clinic here at the station.

- 8. Capt. Hershey and I will be developing the enhancements for our Employee Assistance Program. We are working with local leaders to ensure we develop a great program. The CISM class that I attended will assist us in completing this.

- 10. We are in discussions with Cochise County regarding Archive Social. This is the platform that will store all legally required data from social media sources. We are still hoping to initiate a District Facebook page. If an agreement is reached, the District will be under the Cochise County Archive Social. We hope to pay a small monthly fee that would be much less than having our own Archive Social agreement. Thank you to FF Friedenberg for this great idea.

- 16. Local Emergency Planning Committee report, The LEPC's last meeting was February 20, 2020. The meeting location was changed from the Cochise College in Sierra Vista to the Sierra Vista Police Department. This is a larger venue and can accommodate the growing participation. Again, the LEPC is seeking Tier II reporting facilities within Cochise County to complete site visits and pre-plans. The next meeting is April 16, 2020.
