# **Training:**

- 1. New hire orientation continues.
- 2. Monthly EMS training completed, taught by AirEvac.

#### Wildland:

- 1. DFFM Continues to regularly stage resources at the Richland Station.
- 2. We have had multiple fires and have already billed out more than \$70,000 this fiscal year.
- 3. Austin Garner received the final eval in his ENGB taskbook which will now be sent to the state qualification committee for approval.

#### **Out of District Services:**

1. Exploring annexation options as requested by surrounding community members.

#### **Emergency Medical Services:**

- 1. Ambulance rate increase packet was re-submitted with changes as requested by AZDHS.
- 2. Working on updating our ambulance contract with AMR for nationwide disaster response.

#### **Hazardous Materials and Technical Rescue:**

1. HazMat FRO class has been requested and scheduled for August. Class will be taught in Willcox to help engage regional partners.

#### Maintenance

- 1. There are 14 pending apparatus work orders.
- 2. There are 4 equipment work orders.
- 3. The station roof and quarters HVAC have been replaced. Awaiting USDA payment.
- 4. New C-30 has been purchased. Outfitting is underway.
